1- INTRODUCTION (ARNAUD DE SURVILLE)

For my part ...I wish this morning to talk about.... happiness. We have many many reasons to be happy.

First of all Xmas is around the corner. Also and more seriously, I am happy....and so should you by the way....happy because more than ever we are: strong and serene. Let me explain.

First of all, we are stronger than ever. Stronger thanks to our team.... Our recruitment plan which kept us very busy for almost 2 years is now completed. FIS organization is in full throttle. It is a remarkable powerhouse, capable of delivering the level of service expected by 3,000 students, 500 staff and a zillion anxious parents. Stronger thanks to the state of our finances. Thanks to your support we now have the means of our ambitions.Fabrice will walk you through the key figures this morning.

Stronger thanks to the dedication of our teachers and students. This year again they have achieved fantastic results at their exams. We are very proud of them.

Second reason to be happy: we are serene when looking at our future: with the new campus in TKO we know we will be able to manage our growth with serenity, at least for the coming 10 years. TKO also gives us the opportunity to grow the international stream... grow to a level where it can compete more effectively in the market. And with the extension at BPR our seniors will soon have many quiet corners to smoke and kiss in peace (just kidding).

Our new financial policy allows us to spend more money on badly needed renovations and quick-win improvements.We are effectively and economically buying time.

Our enrollment statistics are finally slowing down. It is much easier for us to manage a growth that is essentially organic....it allows us to plan in anticipation rather than rush in reaction.

The final reason for being happy is the progress we've made in formulating our vision. We are almost there; the next challenge is for all of us to incarnate it. Being strong and serene allows us to build for our future with confidence.... The foundations of this construction are: Vision...campus....community...and governance.

Working on a vision is asking ourselves what kind of school we want to be... Working on our vision means adapting our curriculum to best prepare our kids for jobs that do not exist yet... Working on our vision is accepting that our old models may not work for them....It may well be accepting that the most important skills for tomorrow are not academic.

Some questions about campuses... which one should we pull down and rebuild first, Blue Pool or Jardines? Where and how soon can we mobilize the funds? Should we have an en-catchment policy? How do we best split students across 4 campuses?

- Community is us parents and corporates; how can we lighten the burden of those for whom the school fees are too heavy? Community also means our hosts and how can we engineer more exchanges and encourage a deeper integration?
- Governance is about defining the systems and procedures to safeguard sustainability, continuity and harmony. It is about transforming complexity into order. Notwithstanding (I like this word don't you?) before we run we have to walk. Here are the priorities we have assigned to ourselves for this academic year:
- Vision: the most important step is the first one, winning the community over to buy in. Marie-Aude will explain us the process later on this morning.
- Campuses: kick-start the project of extension at BPR. We'll show some new perspectives after the vote.
- Community: get the community in general and our corporate members in particular to endow a solidarity fund. Time is of essence and Romain will tell us why later on.



Governance: two subjects: compiling our by-laws and renewing the convention with AEFE. More on these two subjects with Mark and myself towards the end of our show.

So for those of you who just arrived and for those of you who dozed off for a while; let me sum up. We have very good reasons to be proud and happy of how far we've come:

- We are very well equipped to write our future and engineer changes.
- However, we need to be very clear... on one very important truth: What got us here will not get us there.
- Our success depends on our capacity, as a community to mobilize collectively our resources. In other words, we need your continuing support. Thank you

- b. Revocation and cancellation of the resolution regarding adoption of a new set of Articles of the Association passed at the earlier general meeting held on 06/06/2016.




5- APPROVAL OF THE LAST GENERAL MEETING MINUTES (MARK BENNETT)

The final draft minutes of the EGM held on June 6, 2016, is available online since Sept. 21, 2016 and is unanimously approved.



6- FINANCE: BUDGET 2016-17 (FABRICE RAULT)





Result is in line with what we are aiming for. The school increased plan to face the development needs.



Fabrice Rault presented the above slides to the members of the Association related to the preliminary results of the accounts 2015-16 (audited accounts will be submitted at the next AGM) and the current year budget highlights. Income figures are re stated with school fees set aside from the development fund.

On behalf of Adrien Cassanet, treasurer of the Association, Fabrice Rault delivered the following keys messages:

This year is the last year of high school fees increase (5% on school fees +3% for development); we have heard your concern and aim to return to a figure closer to the inflation – but again this effort was necessary to insure the school development and general upgrades.

TKO finances: we understand parent’s worries but my message is to reassure you on TKO finances. We talk about big figures (around 600 millions) but we have a strong plan:

- a- Partially funded on debentures
- b- An interest free loan from the HK Government that will enable us to the refund the 2 first loans and will be fully refunded on 15 years; bridged by financing with a bank.
- c- 3.5 M Euros of subsidies from AEFÉ

To sum up, we are now properly geared to focus on our development plan..







The following illustration was presented in June 2014 by the board at the EGM. FIS organization is now reaching this organization.







9- SPEECH FROM THE CONSUL GENERAL OF FRANCE AND MACAU (Eric Berti, board director)

Bonsoir à tous, Monsieur le Président, cher Arnaud, Monsieur le Proviseur, cher Christian, Chers parents, Merci d'être venus si nombreux à cette assemblée générale et de prendre sur votre temps pour partager les nouvelles de la vie du Lycée et écouter ceux qui le gèrent quotidiennement avec expertise et dévouement : c'est un moment important de la vie de l'école – car ce lycée est le vôtre et celui de vos enfants.

Félicitations aussi aux nouveaux parents élus : merci de votre engagement! La gestion de cet établissement est complexe et requiert toutes les bonnes volontés et tous les talents. Je serai heureux, pour ma part, de vous retrouver lors des prochaines réunions du conseil d'administration où je siège régulièrement.

Le proviseur et plusieurs membres du Conseil d'administration du Lycée viennent d'évoquer des sujets essentiels de la vie de l'école : excellence académique, projets immobiliers, projets pédagogiques, finances de l'établissement, etc.

Je voudrais, pour ma part, vous adresser deux messages :

Mon premier message est un message de satisfaction et de fierté : le Lycée français est partout, ici à Hong Kong, synonyme de réussite de la communauté française. Les Français de HK sont attachés au lycée car cet établissement est une réussite pour la communauté française. C'est le plus grand lycée français d'Asie, avec 4 campus, plus de 2700 élèves et 300 personnels. C'est un pilier historique de la présence française à HK et un élément important de notre rayonnement ici. Le Lycée français de Hong Kong c'est aussi une réussite académique et un lieu d'excellence académique. Chaque année les résultats aux Brevet, IGCSE, Baccalauréats français et international sont excellents et situent notre lycée dans les tous premiers au monde avec 100% de réussite au Bac et 50% de mentions très bien.

Je veux féliciter les équipes pédagogiques et administratives pour ces résultats remarquables. Bravo au proviseur et à tous les professeurs de vos enfants qui savent, chaque année, mener des projets pédagogiques stimulants et innovants et les conduire vers le succès. Nous avons eu le plaisir de féliciter les bacheliers 2016 le 2 juillet au lycée et le 3 juillet à la résidence de France pour les meilleurs d'entre eux! Ce sont des moments très heureux dans la vie d'un consul général.

Le proviseur évoquait cela brièvement tout à l'heure : la moitié de nos élèves vont en France pour poursuivre leurs études supérieures, en classes préparatoires, en médecine, à Sciences po et l'autre moitié part étudier à l'étranger, au Royaume uni pour la plupart, au Canada, aux États-Unis dans les meilleures universités anglo-saxonnes. Ils deviennent ainsi des ambassadeurs du lycée français et contribuent largement à diffuser cette excellente image dont il bénéficie.

2. Mon second message est un message de confiance : le lycée français va pouvoir s'agrandir prochainement grâce à cette image très favorable dont il bénéficie et au fort soutien des autorités locales. En effet, vous le savez, la communauté française de HK est en constante croissance : elle a doublé depuis 2006 et a cru de 6% en 2015. Mais nous pouvons compter sur les autorités locales pour accompagner cette croissance. Ainsi, en effet, selon les plus hautes autorités locales - je pense, par exemple, à Carrie Lam, n°2 du Gouvernement de Hong Kong - la communauté française contribue au développement de HK par sa présence économique, sa présence culturelle au-delà de sa présence historique. C'est ainsi que le lycée a pu obtenir le nouveau site de Tseung Kwan O, dans les nouveaux territoires - là où plus du tiers des familles françaises vivent désormais. Les travaux progressent, vous l'avez entendu, les fondations sont en cours de finalisation et le bâti sera ensuite érigé début 2017. Le calendrier

est serré et tout doit être mis en œuvre pour que les délais soient respectés puisque ce campus ouvrira à la rentrée 2018.

A cet égard, j'entends dire ici ou là, par les uns ou les autres, que les frais de scolarité deviennent difficiles à supporter pour certaines familles. Je suis bien conscient de cela et des difficultés que cela peut engendrer pour certains mais je veux dire aussi que le consulat demeure très vigilant au coût de la scolarité, comme vous tous ici présents. Une hausse de 8 % des frais de scolarité avait en effet été entérinée pour une période de trois ans (2015-2017) : c'est une hausse importante mais nécessaire pour permettre la construction de ce nouveau campus et, bientôt, l'agrandissement de celui de Blue pool road. Elle devrait marquer un arrêt désormais. Et je vous rappelle aussi l'existence des bourses scolaires données par le gouvernement français sur critères sociaux. Une cinquantaine de familles en bénéficient chaque année.

Je finirai ce discours en exprimant ma fierté de voir ce nouveau campus se construire : il sera à la pointe des technologies protectrices de l'environnement, à la pointe des méthodes pédagogiques, autour du concept de « villa pédagogique » permettant une plus grande porosité entre filières française et internationale ; à la pointe, aussi, de l'esthétique architecturale en vigueur en ce moment, grâce à la très belle proposition du cabinet Henning Larsen et à l'architecte Claude Godefroy ; à la pointe, enfin, de modes de financement innovants grâce à une campagne de levée de fonds énergique et audacieuse à laquelle, je le dis en toute modestie, le Consulat apporte toute sa contribution en ouvrant notamment la porte de mécènes privés et d'institutions locales privées, très intéressés par ce très beau projet.

Je m'arrête là et vous remercie de votre attention. Bonne fin de soirée à tous.




Arnaud de Surville reported that the legal committee is working of the Bye Laws, FIS internal rules of good governance that will be published on the parent portal when ready.






Question 2: Collège (6e-3e) / Lower Secondary (Y7-Y11):


